PRIVACY POLICY - TERMET SYSTEM COMFORT

(Policy for personal data protection)

- 1. The administrator of personal data processed in the scope and purpose necessary to provide services is TERMET S.A. TAX ID: 884-16-31-476, REGON: 890346982, e-mail: termet@termet.com.pl , phone: 74 856 06 01 (cost of connection in accordance with the tariff of your operator), for which registration files are kept by the District Court for Wrocław Fabryczna, IX Commercial Department of the National Court Register under the number KRS 000041459 (hereinafter referred to as "Administrator").
- 2. The data is processed in order to provide services related to registration, identification and remote access to a device called the Comfort Module, which is part of the set of devices that make up the Comfort System for managing the thermal comfort of rooms / room sets. The person whose are processed has the right to withdraw consent at any time.
- 3. The administrator processes data in accordance with the law, collects it for marked, lawful purposes and does not transfer it to further processing incompatible with these purposes. Data is collected only to an adequate, necessary and indispensable extent in relation to the purposes for which it is processed.
- 4. The administrator makes every effort to protect users' personal data against unauthorised access by any third parties and in this respect, it applies high-level organisational and technical security measures. The administrator does not disclose personal data to any unauthorised persons in accordance with the mandatory provisions of law in this respect.
- 5. The administrator stores data for a period no longer than is necessary to achieve the objectives (point 2) for which the person whose data are processed has consented or until the consent is withdrawn.
- 6. The person whose data are processed has the right to request from the administrator access to the content of his/her personal data, the right to rectify it, delete or limit processing. The person whose data are processed also has the right to lodge a complaint to the supervisory body in the event of unlawful processing of his/her personal data.
- 7. Providing personal data is voluntary, however, failure to provide data marked as necessary prevents the Comfort Module from being registered, and thus it is not possible to provide services necessary for the Comfort System to operate.
